**LEGACY TO CHURCH IS PUT AT \$846,537**

Broadway Tabernacle's Share in Mrs. Richardson's Estate Is Fixed by Appraisal.

TOTAL IS \$1,106,950 NET

Three Charities Divide \$245,342 Under the de Florez Will—Keteltas Left \$105,525.

The Broadway Tabernacle Society will receive \$846,537 from the \$1,106,950 net estate of Mrs. Harriet M. Richardson, widow of Frank H. Richardson and head of the Richardson Manufacturing Company, makers of jewelry. This was disclosed yesterday with the filing of the transfer-tax appraisal on her estate. Mrs. Richardson died Nov. 27, 1934, at the age of 88.

In addition to the residuary bequest to the Broadway church, Mrs. Richardson left \$2,000 to the Sabbathday Lake Society for the Shakers, Sabbathday, Me.

The gross estate, before deduction of debts and expenses, was \$1,260,544. Securities of \$398,659 included 100 shares, virtually all the stock, of the Richardson Manufacturing Company, \$35,532. The interest in the stock of the Broadway Company and the Enos Richardson Manufacturing Company, entirely owned, was valued at \$40,000.

Real estate in Newark, valued at \$75,000 and including an important estate, and a trust for \$69,500, go to Enos Richardson 4th. Edith Maria Goulden receives \$30,000, plus \$50,242 personal effects.

De Florez Estate, \$476,189

Three charitable organizations divide the \$245,342 residuary estate of Mercedes de Florez, who died on March 20, 1935, the transfer-tax appraisal showed yesterday. The estate was valued at \$501,094 gross and \$378,876 net.

Richmond Memorial Hospital at Princes Bay receives \$35,525, the Staten Island Hospital at Tompkinsville \$20,000, the Volunteers of America at Tottenwille and the Salvation Army at Stapleton \$10,000 each, the Mariners Harbor Baptist Church and Asbury Methodist Episcopal Church at Fort Richmond \$2,000 each. There were seven bequest gifts to individuals totaling \$26,000.

Ollsheimer Left \$777,605

Henry Ollsheimer, vice president of the Chase National Bank, left an estate of \$929,241 gross and \$777,605 net, of which \$82,778 goes to twenty-three charitable organizations here and in Germany. The transfer tax appraisal showed. He died in Paris on Nov. 6, 1933.

Y. W. C. A. AIDED 3,000,000

Chairman of World Service Council Reports on Work for 1935.

The Young Women's Christian Association served more than 3,000,000 women and girls in the United States in 1935, Miss Katherine Lambert, chairman of the organization's World Service Council, said yesterday at the council's annual meeting, held at the home of Mrs. Ray P. Stevens, 834 Fifth Avenue.

**Holiday Shoppers Warned of Pickpockets; Police List 'Don'ts' for Persons in Crowds**

Heralding the approach of Christmas, Acting Captain Walter Rustis, in charge of the police headquarters pickpocket squad, issued a list of warnings to shoppers yesterday. His warnings to women follow: "Keep your mind on your handbag, or your shopping will cease suddenly."

"Protect your money by keeping it in a safe place at home. Carry only enough money with you for the day's shopping. "Be suspicious of people who are discursive and who jostle you. They are usually bag openers who make that a part of their psychology to take your mind off your bag. "Shop in the morning if possible. You will obtain better service and less delay.

**NEW NRA NEEDED, MGR. RYAN ASSERTS**

Advocates Barring Supreme Court Reviews or Amending the Constitution.

ROCHESTER, N. Y., Nov. 30.—Legislation by Congress, comparable to the NRA, either under the Richberg proposal barring a Supreme Court review or by constitutional amendment, was recommended tonight by Mgr. John A. Ryan, Professor of Moral Theology and Industrial Ethics in the Catholic University of Washington, D. C., to the Catholic conference on industrial problems.

He declared such legislation as that proposed by the Council for Industrial Progress was essential to insure "a shorter work week until all those now out of work are re-employed" and that "minimum wage rules to increase the buying power of labor" were necessary.

Relative to Donald Richberg's proposal that Congress in enacting new legislation should deny the Supreme Court the power to review its enactments, Mgr. Ryan said: "In Mr. Richberg's opinion, Congress has the power to do this under Article III, Section II, Paragraph 2 of the Federal Constitution. By this provision the Supreme Court is given appellate jurisdiction with such exceptions and under such regulations as the Congress may make."

Back Mgr. Ryan's View

By The Associated Press. ROCHESTER, N. Y., Nov. 30.—A definite trend toward revival in part of the principles of the NRA was foreseen by leaders of the Catholic conference on industrial problems, meeting here today. The Rev. R. A. Mowman of Washington, assistant director of the National Catholic Welfare Conference, agreed with Mgr. Ryan that labor groups and business men as well will seek legislation to reinstate the NRA in some guise.

A window cleaner barely escaped a plunge to death yesterday when the left buckle of his safety belt slipped, leaving him hanging suspended seven floors above the sidewalk on the face of a building at 19 West Thirty-fourth Street, opposite the Empire State Building.

**TWO TO BE CLEARED IN MORTGAGE TRIAL**

Court Indicates a Directed Acquittal of Some National Title Guaranty Aides.

SIX OTHERS STILL ACCUSED

Part of Conspiracy and Mail Fraud Counts Are Dropped as Case Nears Close.

Two of the eight former officers and directors of the defunct National Title Guaranty Company on trial before Federal Judge Harlan W. Rippey in Brooklyn will be acquitted by direction of the court, it was indicated yesterday as their attorneys began gumming up in their trial on conspiracy and mail fraud charges.

Although technically reserving decision on various motions of counsel, the court said that "at the proper place" the motions to acquit James L. Bennett, assistant secretary, and C. Howell German, manager of the sales department, would be granted.

Savings of \$114,000 annually to consumers in Freeport and Rockville Center are contained in revised electric rate schedules submitted to the Public Service Commission by the municipal power plants in those two villages. The commission announced yesterday the new rates would go into effect this month.

**CHURCH CRISIS SEEN BY BISHOP MANNING**

'Miracle' of Unity Is Needed to Meet Today's Problems, He Tells Baptist Clergy.

Because of present world conditions the church is facing what perhaps its greatest crisis in all history, Bishop William T. Manning declared yesterday morning before fifty members of the Baptist Union Association at their weekly conference at the Madison Avenue Baptist Church, 30 East Thirty-first Street.

Urging Universal Christian unity, the bishop said that "none of us are or can be satisfied with the present situation" and asserted that there was never a time when the gospel of Christ was more needed than today.

**ALL STATES INVITED TO JOIN 1939 FAIR**

Lehman Urges Exhibit by Each in Letters to Governors, Asking Their Participation.

STRESSES 'FUTURE' THEME

Fair Will Show 'Materials and Ideas, Things and Forces That Affect Lives,' He Says.

ALBANY, Nov. 30.—Governors of all the States have been invited by Governor Lehman to participate in the World's Fair in New York beginning April 30, 1939, which will celebrate the 150th anniversary of the inauguration of George Washington and the establishment of the Federal Government in New York City.

In his invitation Governor Lehman observed that the State Government was cooperating officially with the New York World's Fair, 1939, Inc., the private non-profit corporation charged with the construction and operation of the fair. "The World's Fair will display the most brilliant achievements in art, science and industry," he said.

"The State of New York, as host State to the World's Fair of 1939, is deeply interested in the fair, and the far-reaching possibilities it holds for every participant. I trust that the State of New York will be favorably disposed to participate in the fair by a display of the predominant contributions your State has made in the fields embraced by the theme of the fair."
